

Veronica 'Blue Yonder'

Key Features

- ✓ Striking deep violet blue blooms.
- ✓ Tight creeping mat forming habit.
- ✓ Dark almost black stems really making the flowers pop.

Genus & Species:	<i>Veronica hybrid (Estimated V. allionii x liwanensis)</i>
Protection Status:	US Plant Patent Applied For.
USDA Zone:	USDA Zone 4. (-30°F or -34°C).
Bloom:	Abundant sprays of striking deep violet blue blooms.
Bloom Period:	Summer.
Foliage:	Small ovate to lance shaped dark green foliage, stems and petioles are dark almost black in color.
Habit:	Tight creeping mat forming habit. 4" x 15". (6" in flower)
Propagation:	Tip Cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Easily grown in full sun to partial shade, moist well-drained soil.
Additional Comments:	Drought tolerant once established. Attracts bees and butterflies.
Uses:	Containers, borders, mass landscape planting.

Approximate Finishing Time

1 Quart:	10-12 weeks
1 Gallon:	12-14 weeks

Closest Variety: *W. 'Christy'* PP18,142
