

Campsis Tango = 'Huitan'

Key Features

- ✓ Large red clusters of trumpet shaped blooms.
- ✓ Prolific blooming.
- ✓ Compact growth habit, can be grown as a shrub.

Characteristics

Genus & Species:	<i>Campsis radicans</i>
Protection Status:	US Plant Patent 16,656.
USDA Zone:	USDA Zone 6. (-10°F or -23°C).
Bloom:	Clusters of red trumpet-shaped blooms.
Bloom Time:	Late spring to early summer, holds blooms until fall.
Foliage:	Shiny dark green foliage.
Habit:	Vining habit but more compact than traditional varieties.
Propagation:	Semi ripe softwood cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Best in full sun to light shade in a well draining soil. Takes well to trellising.
Additional Comments:	All branches produce flowers, making this a much more prolific bloomer than traditional <i>Campsis</i> varieties.
Uses:	Container specimens with trellis, shrub, garden arbor or fence specimen, landscape plantings.

Approximate Finishing Time

1 Gallon:	3 months
2 Gallon:	6-12 months

Key Differences:

- ✓ **'Tango'** Red blooms **vs.** Orange-Salmon blooms.
- ✓ **'Tango'** heavy bloomer **vs.** average bloomer.
- ✓ **'Tango'** compact vining habit **vs.** aggressive vining habit.
