

## SUPERSEMPs® *Sempervivum* 'Fire Quartz'

### Key Features

- ✓ Large to extra-larger rosettes. 8" x 8".
- ✓ Excellent summer foliage color.
- ✓ A stiking 2 gallon plant with a long period of seasonal interest.



### Characteristics

<b>Genus &amp; Species:</b>	<i>Sempervivum hybrid</i>
<b>Protection Status:</b>	US Plant Patent 33,603.
<b>USDA Zone:</b>	Zone 3. (-40°F or -40°C).
<b>Bloom:</b>	Foliage selection, slow to flower. Pink star shaped flowers, held in clusters, on stout fleshy stems.
<b>Bloom Time:</b>	Mid-late summer.
<b>Foliage:</b>	Colorful rosette foliage. Color phasing from green through rich burgundy. Deepest foliage color in full sun, mid-summer. Unlike some hybrids with best color in winter to early spring.
<b>Habit:</b>	Large single rosette. 8" x 8".
<b>Propagation:</b>	TC & Offsets. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
<b>Culture:</b>	Well-drained soil in full sun for best color.
<b>Additional Comments:</b>	Drought tolerant once established. Common name: Hens and Chicks. (Renamed from Rose Quartz)
<b>Uses:</b>	Low-water Containers, Garden Border, Xeriscape landscapes.

### Approximate Finishing Time

<b>1 Gallon:</b>	<b>6-8 weeks</b>
<b>2 Gallon:</b>	<b>10-12 weeks</b>

**Comparison:** S. 'Commander Hay'

- ✓ 'Fire Quartz' burgundy tinted rosettes **vs.** red tinted rosettes.
- ✓ 'Fire Quartz' large – extra-large rosettes **vs.** small-medium rosettes.
- ✓ 'Fire Quartz' excellent summer color **vs.** excellent spring color.
