Characteristics

Genus & Species:	<i>Cotoneaster x suecicus</i> (Code: OSUCOT1)
Protection Status:	US Plant Patent 31,719
USDA Zone:	USDA Zone 5 (-20°F or -28.9°C). Currently Testing
Bloom:	White blooms in spring followed by colorful orange fall berries.
Bloom Time:	Spring-summer. Flowering in year 3.
Foliage:	Shiny small dark green foliage. Flush purple with cool fall temperatures.
Habit:	Ultra-compact, compact spreading shrub. 1' x 3'.
Propagation:	Softwood cuttings. <i>License required for propagation.</i>
Culture:	Happy in sun to part shade in average soils.
Additional Comments:	Exhibiting improved fire blight resistance. Thrifty on water use once established. Has performed well at UC Davis trials under drought stress and disease inoculation.
Uses:	Container specimens, garden specimen, mass landscape plantings.

1 Quart:	8-10 months
1 Gallon:	12-14 months
